"Carbon Capture and Sequestration"

Abstract:

The issue of Climate Change and how to respond to calls to reduce GHG emissions in the face of insatiable demand for fossil fuel and need for economic growth is one of the most long term and vexing policy issues confronting the world and every jurisdiction of government. Premier Ed Stelmach recently announced the creation of a \$2 billion fund to advance carbon capture and storage (CCS) projects on a large scale. What is CCS and why are the Province of Alberta, coal power generators and oil sands developers counting on this CO2 management strategy to deliver massive reductions in GHG emissions in the coming decades? Canada and Alberta have a successful history of public support for private sector mega-projects that advance the national interest going back to the National Dream and the CPR, the Trans-Canada Pipeline, the Alberta Gas Trunkline, Syncrude and Hibernia. This presentation will address these questions and focus on the challenges and opportunities associated with CCS in Alberta.
