"Engineering and a Water-Short Economy"

Abstract:

Water quality and quantity constraints are increasingly affecting the design of infrastructure for municipal, agricultural and industrial water users in the South Saskatchewan River Basin. The SSRB Water Management Plan imposed a restriction on new surface water allocations and enabled a trade in water licensing. The Bow River Basin Council has recently published new Water Quality Objectives that will impose new requirements for improving the quality of return flows to the River. The authors will discuss emerging trends in Alberta's water-short economy including: economics of water transfers, irrigation sector conservation initiatives, low impact development and wastewater reclamation.

Mr. Bill Berzins P.Eng. has more than 27 years experience is water, wastewater and environmental infrastructure projects throughout western North America. Currently, as President of Fossil Water Corporation, he is developing water infrastructure projects for municipal and industrial clients in the Bow, North Saskatchewan, Athabasca and Columbia River Basins.
