“SE Stoney Trail Project – The Saga of the Ring Continues”

Abstract:

The NW and NE sections of Stoney Trail were opened to traffic in Nov. 2009. In March 2009 Alberta Transportation issued a Request for Qualifications for teams interested in undertaking the Design / Build / Finance / Operation and Maintenance of the SE Stoney Trail Project. This project will result in the completion of an additional 25 kms of the Calgary Ring Road including 27 individual bridge structures. Of the five teams submitting qualifications, the top three were invited to respond to the Request for Proposals released on May 19, 2009. The P3 Agreement was signed on March 31, 2010 with the successful proponent, Chinook Roads Partnership. The new and upgraded roadway is to be open to traffic on Oct. 01, 2013.

The presentation will focus on the elements of this section of the Calgary Ring Road Project with an update on the other sections of the Calgary Ring Road.

About the Speakers:

Garry is the Urban Construction Manager for Calgary with Alberta Transportation. He is the Project Sponsor for all new Provincial Highway work within the City of Calgary, which includes the Calgary Ring Road and the Deerfoot Trail. Garry is a native of Calgary and he obtained a B.Sc. (Civil Eng.) from the University of Calgary in 1975 and he completed his Masters of Engineering Degree in 1983. He has spent his career working in the Calgary area, primarily in the field of project management. Projects have included expansions of Calgary's water treatment plants, the Calgary Convention Centre, the expansion of Mount Royal College and now the design and construction of the Calgary Ring Project.
