Kananaskis (KA) and Rundle Halls (RU)

Kananaskis and Rundle Halls are designed for first-year residents looking for a fun and welcoming community. Offering dormitory-style living in fully furnished single and double rooms (also known as “trad” rooms), these buildings are where lifelong friendships start.

Residents love Kananaskis and Rundle Halls because of the incredible sense of community. Living here means being surrounded by fellow first-years who are experiencing university life together. Shared lounges and monthly events on each floor bring everyone together, creating a fun and supportive environment.

Promoting inclusivity, residents can choose between all-gender or single-gender wings. When placed in a double room, residents will be matched with a roommate who shares living style and interests based on the roommate questionnaire responses (see page 15 for more info about roommates).

UCalgary's Residence team is proud to offer residents the opportunity to select their own roommate, which not every university does!

First-Year Residence Guarantee

All students applying directly from high school and are 21 or younger are guaranteed a place in Residence for their first year, if they apply by May 1.

International House (IH)

International House is home to first-year residents, featuring single and two-bedroom suite style units. Each suite comes with a private bathroom, which is shared with a roommate in the two-bedroom suite. This Residence offers a great balance of personal space and community interaction.

International House is home to the Scholars' Advantage award floor. Scholars' Advantage students receive monthly light service cleaning and linen changes. They also experience enhanced academic programming from our Residence Experience Team.

Yamnuska Hall (YA)

Yamnuska Hall is home to a mix of first and second year residents. Residents have their own private bedroom and can live in one, two or three-bedroom suites. Each suite comes equipped with its own bathroom and a full size fridge which are shared with roommates for two and three-bedroom suites. Beyond the suites, each floor features a community lounge and event kitchen for social gatherings and building events.

One-Bedroom Suite Specs

- The suite is 356 square feet (bedroom is 187 square feet) and includes a double XL mattress, desk, chair, armoire and dresser

- Sectional living room furniture

Two and Three-Bedroom Suite Specs

- Every bedroom is 135 square feet and includes a double XL mattress, dresser, bookcase, armoire, desk and chair
- Shared bathroom
- Suite includes refrigerator, microwave, sink, cupboard, kitchen table and chairs



All You Care To Eat in The Landing

All first-year residents can choose between a required 5-or 7-day All You Care To Eat (AYCTE) meal plan.

Living away from home for the first time can be challenging and learning to cook, meal planning and budgeting can often feel daunting for first-year residents. To ease the transition, we support residents in their first year by having a required 5-or 7-day meal plan at our dining hall, The Landing. Our all-access plans allow residents to come and go as they please, and eat as much as they like, when they like!

The Landing is located in the Dining Centre and serves healthy and nutritious options for breakfast, lunch, dinner and continuous dining between mealtimes. The Landing also serves gluten-free, vegan, vegetarian, and Halal options.

Regular hours at The Landing are 7 a.m. - 11 p.m. on weekdays and 8 a.m. - 9 p.m. on weekends, so residents can fuel up whenever the time is right for them!

Meal plan options for first-year residents:

- **5-Day:** Mon. - Fri.
- **7-Day:** Mon. - Sun.

Residence and meal plan fees are paid at the same time as one combined fee. Meal plan fees are due on the tuition and Residence fee payment deadline for the academic term in September and January.

Your Go-To Resources in Residence

Support, Safety and Student Engagement

Community Ambassadors (CAs) are student leaders who live in residence and create a safe and welcoming environment. They can show residents where the laundry room is, organize events for each floor and can point them in the direction of helpful campus resources.

Residence Life Coordinators (RLCs) are full time, live-in professionals who oversee community engagement, Residence programs, safety and support. Prioritizing resident wellness, RLCs are experienced staff and can advise new residents on managing school schedules, workload and semester planning.

Between our CAs, RLCs and Campus Security, our team is on call 24/7.



Housekeeping and Maintenance

Housekeeping frequently cleans common areas such as hallways, study areas and communal bathrooms. They are available for hire for residents who need more support with keeping their room clean. There is also a dedicated maintenance team that will fix issues such as needing a new lightbulb.

On top of these services, twice per academic term and once in the spring and summer (once per semester), Residence staff will conduct room inspections. Room inspections are a quick check-in to ensure a resident's space is safe and comfortable. It is also an opportunity for us to see if residents need any support, whether that is maintenance, cleaning or anything else to help them feel at home.

Mental Health Support

Residents have access to free, confidential counseling through the Residence Student Support Advisor. Whether a resident is feeling stressed, anxious, lonely or facing other challenges, professional counselors are here to support them.



Student Conduct Office

The Student Conduct office is here to help if a resident ever faces a conflict or has a concern in Residence. They offer confidential advice, referrals and guidance on resolving non-academic misconduct. Residents can also access training to navigate potential roommate conflicts.



Applying for Residence

Important Dates

Applying for Academic Term (September - April): Applications open **November 1**.

First-Year Residence Guarantee - All students applying directly from high school and are 21 or younger are guaranteed a place in Residence for their first year, if they apply by **May 1**.

Application Process:

1. Log in to the Resident Portal



5. Check your Resident Portal and email in early May for your offer of Residence

2. Complete the online application form

6. Accept your offer and make the \$1,000 advance payment prior to the payment deadline stated on the Offer of Residence

3. Pay the application fee

7. Keep an eye out for a monthly email throughout the summer to help you prepare for moving into your new home

4. Submit your application

8. Move in and enjoy your new home!

Offers of Residence

Students applying directly from high school and aged 21 or younger are guaranteed a traditional double room in Kananaskis or Rundle Hall.

Applicants can select one preferred room type, if they would prefer to live in a different room type other than a traditional double. Those that would prefer a different room type will be put into a lottery based on their room preference. Applicants that win the lottery will be offered housing for that room type. Those that did not win the lottery will be offered the guaranteed traditional double and be placed on a waitlist for their preferred room type, based on their lottery number.

Roommates

Living with roommates is a big part of university life. Residents can select their own roommate through the Roommate Preference step of their application. Applicants must request each other and be offered the same room type to be placed together.

- **Search by name:** Enter your friend's name to send a request
- **Find a match:** Complete the personal details questionnaire to see suggested profiles



The personal details questionnaire will ask about your study habits, sleep schedule, cleanliness and other important characteristics to ensure you're matched with someone who shares similar traits. **We highly recommend that students fill out the questionnaire themselves to find their best match.**

If you don't have a roommate in mind, browse for matches in June!

Stay in Residence for Spring and Summer

First-year students can continue to live in Residence for the spring and summer. As long as they are enrolled at UCalgary for the upcoming Fall Term, they can stay in Residence from May to August.

Living in Residence throughout the spring and summer offers flexibility, convenience and a built-in community. All-inclusive Residence pricing means there's no need to worry about setting up utilities, Wi-Fi, furniture or tenant insurance. Plus, residents will have a community of friends right outside their door. Our Residence staff are always around to offer support, making sure residents have everything they need for a great summer on campus.

Spring and summer residents enrolled in classes can access Active Living facilities like the fitness centre, pool, racquet centre and climbing centre. Residents not enrolled in classes may purchase a membership at a special reduced rate for the spring and summer.

Summer Residence Events

The Residence Experience Team keeps the fun going all summer long with events and adventures for residents. Past events have included:
