

OUR PAST

The University of Calgary Emeritus Association was started in 1993 by a group of Emeriti faculty to provide a place to get together with other retired university staff. In 2022, the scope of the Association was expanded to include all retirees, including faculty and staff. To reflect this shift, the name was changed to the University of Calgary Retirees Association (UCRA). The UCRA has developed and maintained an affiliation with the College and University Retiree Associations of Canada (CURAC).



How does the UCRA operate?

UCRA is an association of interested members and a volunteer executive. The by-laws allow for up to 12 executive members: President, Vice President & President-Elect, Past President & Graduate College Representative, Secretary, Treasurer/ Membership, Program Chair, Webmaster, *LAR* Editor, CURAC Rep., Social, E-Letter Editor and Members at Large.



What does the UCRA do?

UCRA hosts social and cultural activities such as a President's luncheon in May or June, and a holiday luncheon in December.

UCRA sponsors a series of public lectures of general interest on the second Wednesday of each month from Sept to April.

UCRA publishes a monthly E-letter with information of ongoing issues, presentations, and academic and community achievements.

UCRA can organize interest groups, based on members' interests.

UCRA publishes *LAR* (*Life After Retirement*), a semi-annual newsletter that showcases the activities of UCRA members and the association's activities.

UCRA sponsors an endowed award for an undergraduate Indigenous student attending the University of Calgary.

UCRA reminds the administration and others that many retired members still carry on activities that reflect to the credit of the university.

UCRA serves to identify the needs of individuals planning to retire.

UCRA represents the University of Calgary at CURAC, to advocate for retiree's needs and interests nationally.

Who is eligible for UCRA membership?

According to the association's constitution, anyone who has been granted retiree status by the University of Calgary is eligible to become a member of the Association. Membership may also be granted by the Executive Committee upon written request.
