Welcome to the Hunter Hub for Entrepreneurial Thinking's 2022-23 Impact Report. These pages reflect on achieved accomplishments and a comprehensive look back at the past year, highlighting the successes at meeting strategic goals and priorities. We are a community hub for activities that support entrepreneurial student experiences and enable faculty to lead in innovation through expanding a growing community of entrepreneurial and innovative thinkers.

The Hunter Hub for Entrepreneurial Thinking was founded in 2017 with a \$40 million donation from the Hunter Family Foundation, marking one of the most significant donations in the University of Calgary's history. The Hunters hope that every student who graduates from the University of Calgary will have been exposed to entrepreneurial thinking in some form. The Hunter Hub for Entrepreneurial Thinking is a testament to the power of entrepreneurship and is dedicated to making a lasting impact on the University of Calgary and beyond.

October 2022 marked the next step for the Hunter Hub for Entrepreneurial Thinking, by moving into our permanent home on the fourth floor of the newly constructed Hunter Student Commons, located in the heart of UCalgary's campus. With this new space, our team hopes to

further create meaningful connections and elevate the student experience through programming and events.

While our focus is operationalising and facilitating programming at the Hunter Hub, we know great success isn't achieved without a strong team of creative and innovative individuals. Our continued journey in building out our team has allowed us to bring new energy to the Hunter Hub and create meaningful foundations for our programs and resources to flourish.

Our variety of programs (Experience Ventures, Launchpad, Embedded Certificate in Entrepreneurial Thinking, and Map the System) allowed us to provide students from all disciplines and degree paths opportunities to learn more about applying innovation and entrepreneurialism to their futures. This led to the success of the UCalgary Map the System winners being recognized as top four in Canada and being invited to attend the national competition in Oxford, England. A significant milestone in marking the first time a UCalgary team has reached this stage since beginning to participate in the program.

Nationally, our Experience Ventures program provides experiential learning opportunities that focus on helping post-secondary students develop transferrable skills

through entrepreneurial thinking placements. With partners at 11 post-secondaries across Canada, 3,800 entrepreneurial thinking placements were completed by March 2023. In the coming year, we will continue to grow our impact and see the facilitation of additional placements, enabling students to become future-ready.

It is essential to take a moment to pause and reflect on the accomplishments of the past year. There is much for the Hunter Hub to be proud of. Now, we continue to build on the success achieved and ensure that we work to support a creative and innovative future.

The accomplishments in this Impact Report are a testament to our dedication to our vision. Thank you to the community for your engagement and support, we look forward to continuing to build innovation and ingenuity for the future together.

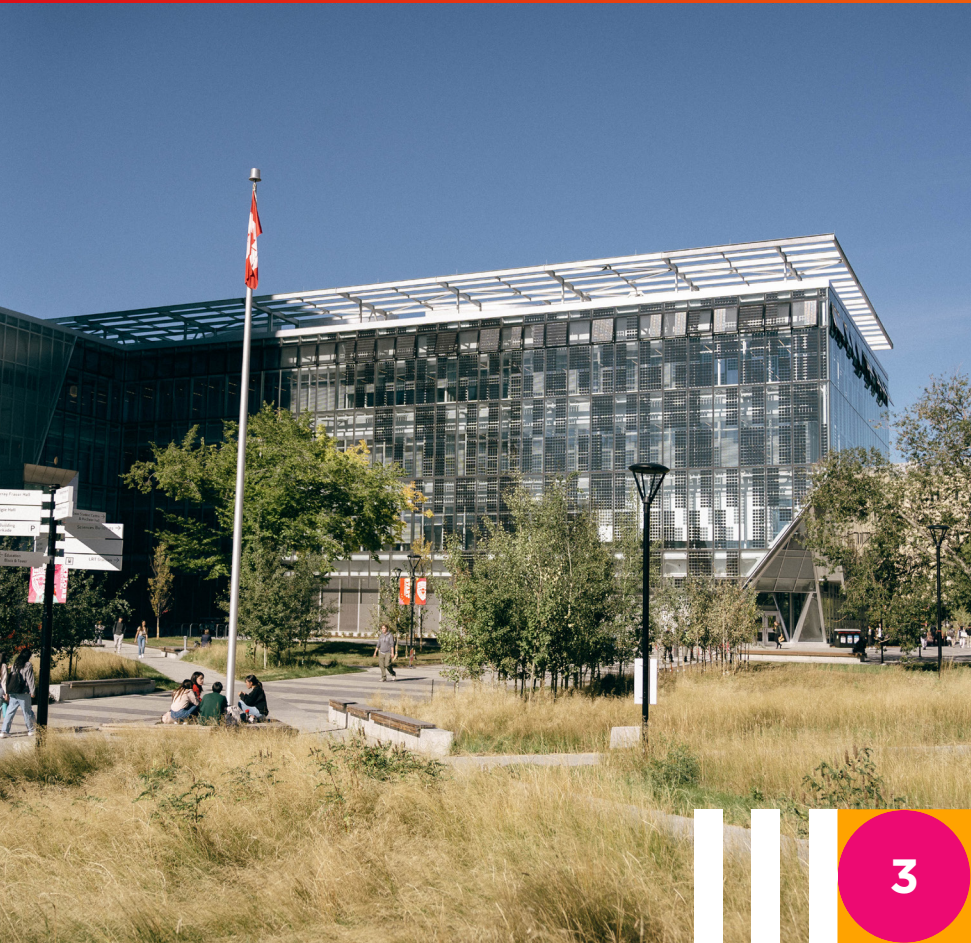
WHAT WE DO

Programming

WHAT WE DO

The Programming team delivers and promotes programs which encourage entrepreneurial thinking across the University of Calgary and Canada. We host an ongoing series of unique and experiential learning programs, workshops and challenges for students, faculty and beyond.

Experience Ventures

Experience Ventures, a nationwide program powered by the Hunter Hub for Entrepreneurial Thinking at the University of Calgary, provides post-secondary students with experiential learning opportunities through entrepreneurial thinking placements that help students develop critical skills that will enable them to become future ready.

An entrepreneurial thinking placement is a structured, short-term opportunity (with honorarium) with an organization that has partnered with a student's school. The goal is to empower students to develop and apply entrepreneurial thinking skills. Experience Ventures offers five types of placements that allow students and local innovators to connect. These placements include hackathons, challenges, projects, student-in-residence, placements, and interdisciplinary team projects.

Through partnerships with post-secondary institutions across Canada, Experience Ventures offers a unique opportunity to create a connection between school and the new world of work. Students experience innovation first-hand and learn how to apply its principles to their careers. Ventures have a chance to connect with future talent to help them power their growth.

Experience Ventures National Hackathon

In March 2023, over 70 students nationwide came together virtually to participate in the second annual Experience Ventures National Hackathon. Students fostered entrepreneurial thinking skills and engaged with local ventures and community members to develop practical solutions that post-secondary institutions could implement to improve food security for students on campus. This hackathon promoted collaboration, taking initiative, and creative problem-solving, all key tenets of entrepreneurial thinking. The finale saw the top three teams pitch for over \$5,000 in prizes.

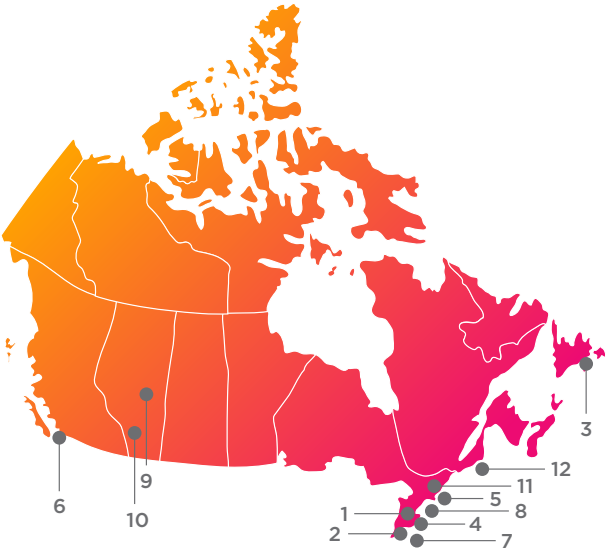

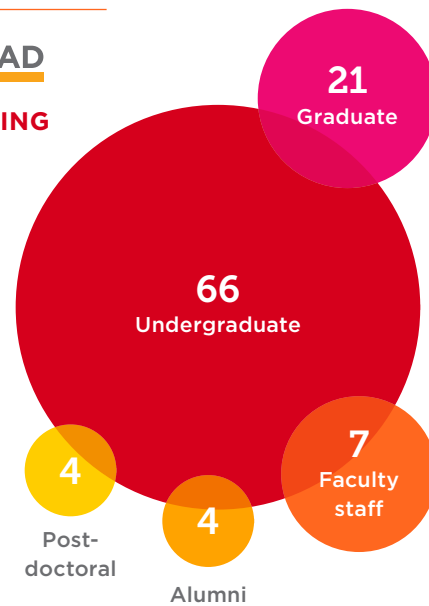

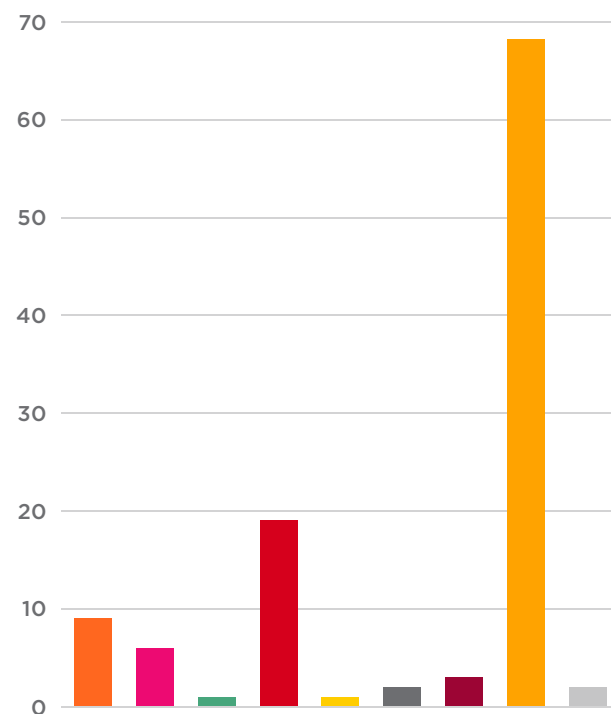


Launchpad

Launchpad Liftoff! Competition

The Launchpad Liftoff! Competition represents the culmination of six months of learning and venture development completed by a diverse group of students from across UCalgary who are enrolled in the Launchpad program. The top eight teams that demonstrated exceptional creativity and dedication to developing their entrepreneurial venture were invited to pitch their venture concepts live to a panel of judges for a chance to win a first-place prize of \$5,000, \$1,000 People's Choice, and \$8,000 in team and individual prizes. This final experience is designed to help teams commit to their ventures and connect with relevant supporters who can help them take their next steps.

Embedded Certificate in Entrepreneurial Thinking



The Hunter Hub's unique capstone program, The Embedded Certificate in Entrepreneurial Thinking, is a partnership between the Haskayne School of Business and the Hunter Hub for Entrepreneurial Thinking that provides undergraduate students from degree paths across the University of Calgary with an entrepreneurial thinking toolkit: the knowledge, experience, mentorship, and capstone project support to make an impact.

As part of the capstone project, students select from a range of support available from the Hunter Hub, including options such as dedicated coaching to support idea development, project funding to cover eligible expenses for prototyping and communications materials, and attending events specifically designed for the Embedded Certificate in Entrepreneurial Thinking student interests.

CLIMATE CHANGE SOLUTIONS FOR SOUTHERN ALBERTA

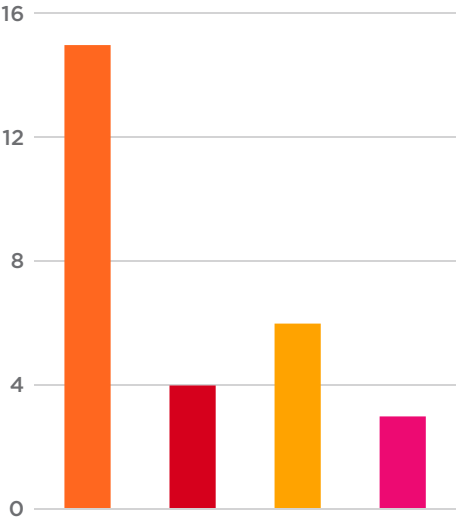

The challenge concluded with students presenting their solutions in an online five-minute pitch style format before a panel of judges.

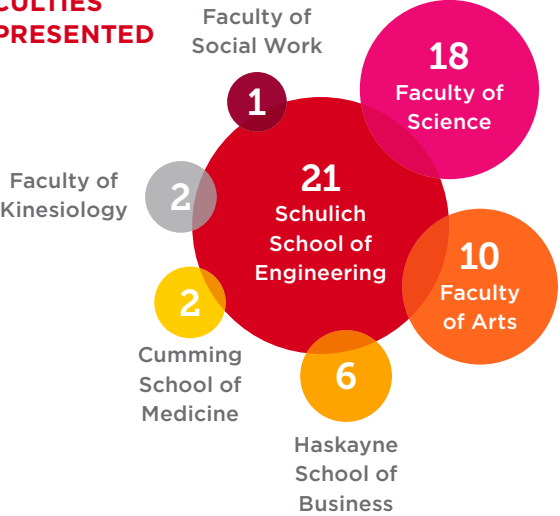

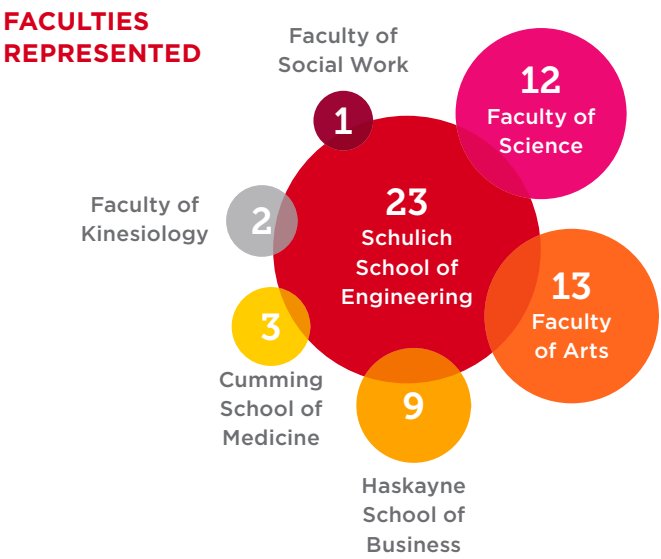

SOCIAL ISOLATION IN THE CALGARY AREA

As the Winter 2023 term came to a close, the Hunter Hub for Entrepreneurial Thinking presented Hunter Hub Solutions Lab: Addressing social isolation in the Calgary area. This three-week challenge pushed students to develop an impactful and feasible project idea that, if executed, would address the real-world issue of social isolation in the Calgary area. The assigned student teams submitted five-minute pitches via online videos for a panel of judges to assess. The challenge concluded with a finale, where the three winning teams were announced.

Map the System

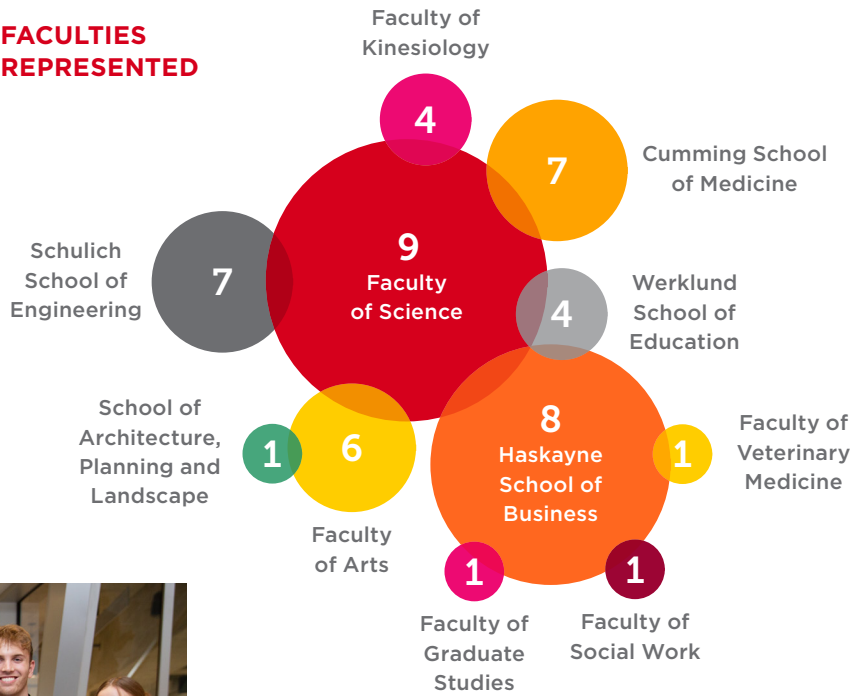
Map the System is a global competition offered by the Skoll Centre for Social Entrepreneurship, delivered in partnership with education institutions around the world. The competition challenges participants to use systems thinking as a guiding approach to understand some of the most complex issues the world faces today. Participants delve deep into a social or environmental issue that matters to them and take the time to explore, probe, and research all its connecting elements and factor. Later, teams share their findings in a way that people can meaningfully understand, share, and learn from.



This year's winning team, Assemble Health, was recognized as top 4 in Canada and top 17 globally out of 60 participating institutions across 27 countries. The UCalgary team attended the Map the System Global Finals in Oxford, England marking the first time a UCalgary team has reached this stage since beginning to participate in the program.

The Hunter Hub facilitates the Cannon Lachapelle Award in Entrepreneurial Thinking, which was established in 2019 with a generous donation from Dr. Elizabeth Cannon and Dr. Gérard Lachapelle. This prestigious award recognizes undergraduate students who demonstrate creativity and entrepreneurial thinking in their academic pursuits. To amplify its impact, the number of recipients has been increased from two to four for 2022. Each deserving student receives \$10,000 per semester, empowering them to further their work and make a positive impact within the UCalgary community and beyond.

This year’s recipients are changemakers who are making a positive impact on their communities. They have demonstrated creative ways of thinking and innovative ways of helping the UCalgary community and beyond. The Hunter Hub is proud to recognize the exceptional individuals who have demonstrated their creativity and innovation in various ways.

Tech Fest

Tech Fest first occurred in Winter 2020, shortly before the COVID-19 pandemic. The inaugural event was a partnership between the Faculty of Science and Schulich School of Engineering, sparked by a computer science student's interest in finding tech opportunities in Calgary. The Hunter Family Foundation was interested in supporting Tech Fest further, and the decision was made to house Tech Fest with the Hunter Hub for Entrepreneurial Thinking.

Tech Fest invited post-secondary students and recent graduates province wide to connect with Calgary's growing tech sector during an in-person career fair February 2023. This event featured networking activities including information booths, interactive video game lounge, and engaging with community leaders who are reshaping the landscape of economic opportunity in our city.

Tech Fest was presented by the Hunter Hub for Entrepreneurial Thinking, in partnership with the Faculty of Arts, Faculty of Graduate Studies, Faculty of Science, Haskayne School of Business, Schulich School of Engineering and the University of Calgary Career Services.

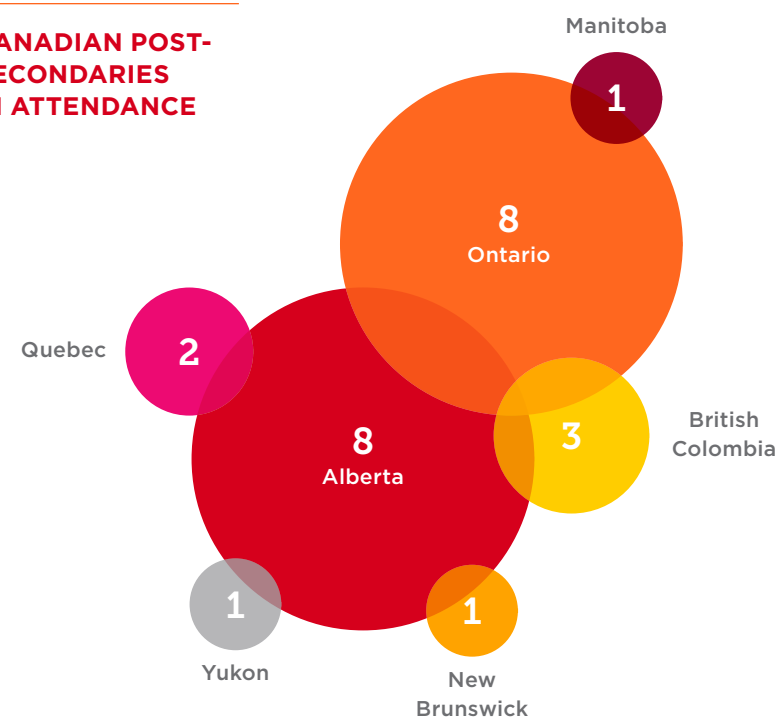
Entrepreneurial Thinking Month

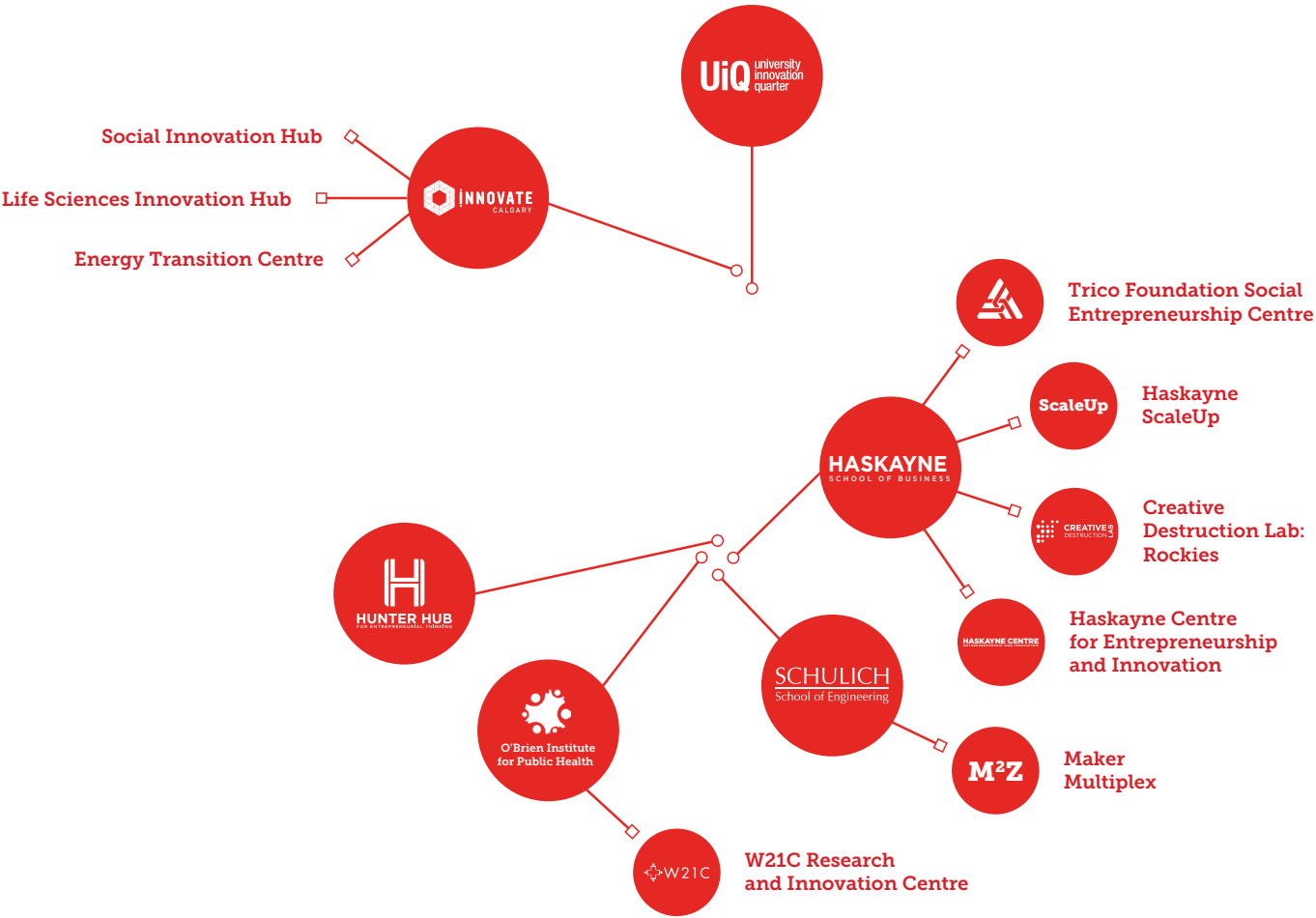
Maker Multiplex (M2)
