ABSTRACT: This talk will use music, art and history as tools to learn about Infectious Diseases and to explore the impact of these diseases on music, art and history. The analysis of compositions during history reveals interactions between infectious diseases and composition. These interactions range from compositions to commemorate epidemics, to compositions likely resulting from the symptoms of infectious diseases, and even use music as a diagnostic test and therapy. Altogether, the talk will be a fun-filled educational experience for a broad audience, from high-school students all the way to senior faculty!
