



MARGARET J. OSLER has a BA in Philosophy from Swarthmore College as well as an MA and a PhD in History and Philosophy of Science from Indiana University in the United States of America. She works as a Full Professor of History in the History Department (<http://hist.ucalgary.ca/faculty/osler-margaret>) and also as an Adjunct Professor in the Department of Philosophy. She is the Program Chair for History in UofC's History and Philosophy of Science Program. Her research and teaching interests comprise particularly the history of the Scientific Revolution, magic, science and religion, science in the 17th century, and the mechanical philosophy from the 17th to the early 19th century. Her publications include, among many others, as co-editor (with John Hedley Brooke): *Science in Theistic Contexts, Osiris*, vol. 16 (2001), as single editor: *Rethinking the Scientific Revolution* (2000), and *Divine Will and the Mechanical Philosophy: Gassendi and Descartes on Contingency and Necessity in the Created World* (1994).
