

Doctors were not always able to see the eye fundus. The ophthalmoscope was one breakthrough discovery in the history of medicine because it allowed doctors to see the retina in a living person. In this talk Dr. Salvati will provide an overview of the evolution of this valuable medical device: from the ophthalmoscope creation of Hermann von Helmholtz and the many improvements that followed and perfected it. The presentation will offer a descriptive sequence of some of the main ophthalmoscopes that time had to offer.
