Diploma Program in Object Oriented Software Technology (OOST)

The Faculty of Continuing Education in cooperation with industry offers a Diploma in Object Oriented Software Technology. The Object Oriented Software Technology (OOST) program focuses on the skills and knowledge that will enable participants to

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successfully work and compete in the exploding e-business, wireless applications and object oriented software development fields. The OOST program consists of approximately 700 hours of information technology training, with emphasis on object oriented programming languages and methodologies. Graduating students are eligible to apply for a four month paid internship. This program is an intense full-time, day program with extensive after class assignment expectations.

Introduction

Objectives

The mandate of the Faculty of Continuing Education may be summarized as follows:

- Build national and international recognition for quality and innovation in Workplace Learning;
- Create high quality, non-credit learning opportunities that foster personal and professional development and renewal, some of which lead to a certificate, diploma, and ladder for degree credit;
- Create improved and expanded access to degree studies for part-time students through the Office of Special Sessions and Master of Continuing Education office;
- 5. Support the French language and culture in Calgary;
- The pursuit of scholarship in the field of adult and continuing education, as well as in other fields and disciplines; and
- Service to the University and the general and professional communities at the provincial, national and international levels.

In fulfilling its mandate, the Faculty works in close cooperation with other units and

faculties of the University and with many partners outside the University community.

Program Details

Minor in Workplace Learning

Introduction

The Faculty of Continuing Education offers a minor program in Workplace Learning. Workplace Learning will help students to develop the knowledge and skills that they need to function effectively in a rapidly changing and challenging workplace and develop strategies to facilitate both their own and their colleagues' learning.

The Minor in Workplace Learning is acceptable in several University of Calgary faculties including Communication and Culture, Humanities, Science, Social Sciences, Kinesiology and Fine Arts. A minor field of study is composed of five full-course equivalents or 400 hours of specified certificate credit.

Requirements

In order to complete the requirements for a Minor in Workplace Learning, students must complete 400 hours of instruction. There are three certificates offered to accomplish this:

Management Certificate

Requires completion of:

- (a) the 300-hour University of Calgary Management Certificate program;
- (b) 60 hours of instruction from an array of courses in the Certificate in Adult Learning; and

(c) the "capstone" 40-hour course Learning in the Workplace.

Certificate in Adult Learning

Requires completion of:

- (a) the 300-hour University of Calgary Certificate in Adult Learning;
- (b) 60 hours of instruction from the wide range of courses offered in the Management Certificate program; and
- (c) the "capstone" 40-hour course Learning in the Workplace.

Certificate in Career Development

Requires completion of:

- (a) the 300-hour University of Calgary Certificate in Career Development;
- (b) 60 hours of instruction from the wide range of courses offered in the Management Certificate program and Certificate in Adult Learning; and
- (c) the "capstone" 40-hour course Learning in the Workplace.

Other Requirements

- The Management Certificate courses on microeconomics and macroeconomics are treated as equivalent to Economics 201 and 203. Students possessing Economics 201 and/or 203 may use these courses as part of their Minor in Workplace Learning or as courses towards a major or minor in Economics. Students electing the latter cannot also receive a minor in Workplace Learning.
- Students who have completed the 400hour requirement for the Minor in Workplace Learning may be eligible for undergraduate credit whether or not the Minor is claimed.
- Successful completion of the five full
 courses of advanced credit (two full-course
 equivalents at the junior level and three
 full-course equivalents at the senior level)
 for the Minor in Workplace Learning will be
 recorded with the designation "CR" instead
 of a grade. Calculation of a GPA will be
 based on the remaining courses taken to
 complete the degree.
- The Faculty of Continuing Education is responsible for deciding the suitability for advanced credit of certificate programs from other institutions.
- Students may take regular undergraduate courses prior to completing the Minor in Workplace Learning.

Spring/Summer Sessions

Each year, the office co-ordinates over 750 courses through 39 academic departments serving over 13,000 course enrollees during

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the University's Spring and Summer Sessions. These intensive courses provide the opportunity for students to progress more quickly through their degree program, participate in a number of innovative courses, and be exposed to visiting professors from around the world. Weekend University

Weekend University provides part-time non-traditional students with an opportunity to complete a University degree and gives full-time students an additional scheduling option. By attending Saturday classes at the University campus students can complete courses for individual credit or pursue the three-year Bachelor of General Studies degree, or the four-year Bachelor of Arts in General Studies degree. Credit Travel Study Program

Credit Travel Study offers students alternate learning environments, international experiences and exposure to diverse cultures while earning credit towards their degree. In the past four years, more than 1000 students have traveled to over forty countries under the tutelage of instructors from the University of Calgary. The programs offered are always varied and often also include instructors from abroad. MCE Program

The Master of Continuing Education program offers a choice of two specializations: Workplace Learning, and Leadership and Development. The focus of the Workplace Learning specialization is to develop professionals who can play a leadership role in creating and shaping learning environments that foster individual and organizational success. The assumption is that continuous learning is a crucial component of productive organizations and institutions. The Leadership and Development specialization was developed to accommodate those students whose career interests are more closely aligned with management and who wish to have greater emphasis on leadership and human resource development. A broad range of learning and management courses have been structured to achieve meaningful and worthwhile learning outcomes for MCE students. Regardless of the delivery method (face-to-face or computer-mediated communication), collaborative critical discourse

is the essential and distinguishing characteristic of the teaching-learning transactions.

The MCE program is comprised of 12 half courses, five of which are required program core courses. Three are specialization core courses that fall under either Leadership and Development or Workplace Learning. Two are elective courses that allow students to pursue particular professional or content interests, and two are half-course equivalents for the final project. The first year begins with an intensive face-to-face three-week institute, followed by two computer-mediated communication (online) core and elective courses delivered in the Fall and Winter terms. The structure of the second year mirrors the first with the exception that students also complete their final projects.
