TRANSFER AWARDS

General Information and Policies

For students entering the University of Calgary who have received transfer credit for the equivalent of at least five full courses completed at another post-secondary institution **or** for University of Calgary students in exchange programs who are returning to the University of Calgary with transfer credit for the equivalent of at least four and one-half full courses completed at their host institution. Students must be pursuing a first degree. Once one year of post-secondary studies is completed at the University of Calgary, transfer students are then eligible to apply for undergraduate awards. Students entering or continuing in the Bachelor of Education (Master of Teaching Program) must apply for awards using the Competitive Undergraduate Awards application form (Deadline is June 15).

Transfer Awards application forms are available from the Student Awards and Financial Aid office by June each year. Application forms may also be printed off the Student Awards and Financial Aid office web site upon availability: www.ucalgary.ca/awards/ Application must be made on the current application form. Completed applications must be post-marked or received by the Student Awards and Financial Aid office on or before **October 1**.

- Selection is based on the admission grade point average calculated by the Registrar's (Admissions) Office.
- In order to be *considered* for scholarships, students must normally present a minimum GPA of 3.20 and to be *considered* for bursaries, students must normally present a minimum GPA of 2.60.
- · Awards are payable only when the student is in actual full-time attendance at the University of Calgary.
- · Supplemental, deferred and special deferred examinations or term work may affect eligibility for awards.
- In order that scholarships may be equitably distributed, students who are transferring from a post-secondary institution in Alberta and are receiving a Louise McKinney Scholarship from that institution may not be awarded a University of Calgary Transfer Award.
- Awards are tenable only at the University of Calgary and only for the current academic year.

The University assumes liability for the payment of scholarships, bursaries, prizes and other awards only to the extent that gifts from donors, or returns from particular investments for these purposes will permit.

As this information is published a considerable time before the opening of the session, the University reserves the right to make whatever changes circumstances may require, including cancellation or addition of particular awards.
