

BIOGRAPHY – Frank Finley

Frank is a student in the Faculty of Arts, pursuing degrees in Political Science and Law and Society. During his time at university, he has been an active member of the community, serving as a past Vice President of the University of Calgary Debate Society, as a founder of the U of C Sustainable Development Goals Alliance, a medalist in the Intercollegiate Business Competition, and as a current member of the Scholars Academy Program. Frank has also lobbied the provincial and municipal governments on a variety of issues, ranging from conflict of interest legislation to youth engagement.

During his summers, Frank has enjoyed time in the field of provincial politics. He has completed internships for the Legislative Assembly of Alberta, the Ministry of Culture and Tourism, and the Alberta Office of the Premier.
