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INTRODUCTION

BACKGROUND

- Alberta is the province with the third highest influx of newcomers to Canada.1
- Compared to 2022, net migration to Alberta increased by 77.9%.²
- Newcomers face challenges in receiving sufficient information to understand the intricacies of the Alberta health care system.³
- This delays health care provision and contributes to development of preventable illnesses.




Figure 1. Net migration to Alberta from January 2012 until *October 2023.*²

OBJECTIVES

The Calgary Asian Medical Students Association (CAMSA) aims to:

- Identify specific areas of difficulties for newcomers to access health care.
- Create an effective pamphlet to reduce barriers to accessing health care for newcomers.

RESEARCH

METHODOLOGY

- Form focus groups with newcomers to understand their lived experiences and gather suggestions.
- Collaborate with healthcare professionals to identify barriers immigrants face in healthcare access.
- Design and translate pamphlets into multiple languages and distribute the pamphlets with newcomer societies.
- Assess efficacy of the pamphlet with thorough qualitative feedback from users.

RESULTS

Uncertainty about where and from whom to seek care

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
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


