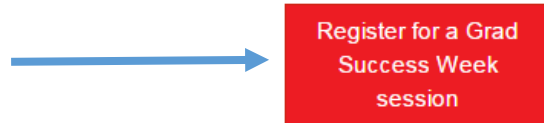


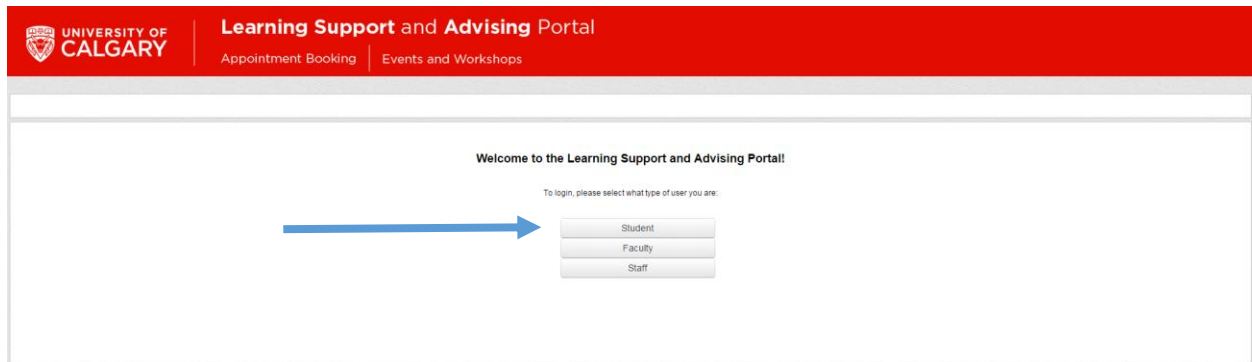

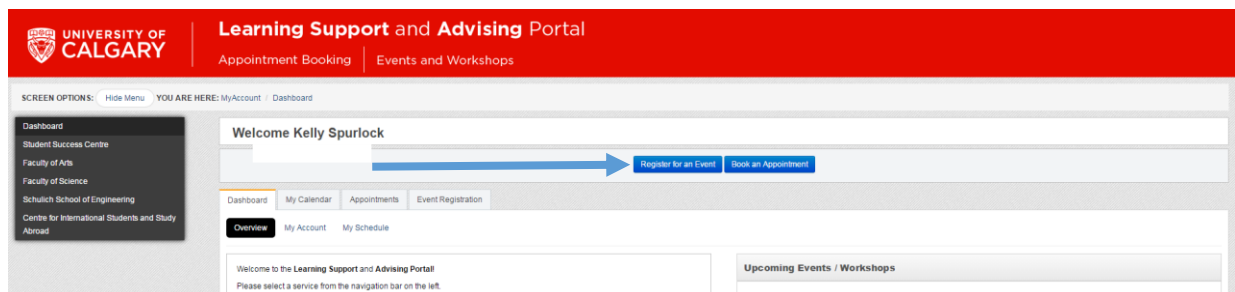
**Step 1: Click on “Register for a Grad Success Week Session”.**



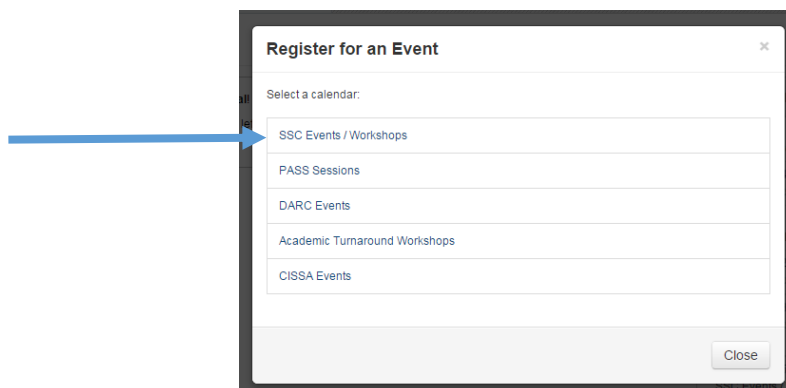
**Step 2: Click on “Student” and log in using your eID and password.**

<p><b>Grad Success Week (GSW): Keynote</b></p> <p><b>May 3, 2016 09:00 AM to 10:20 AM</b></p> <p>Piers Steel is a professor in the Haskayne School of Business at the University of Calgary (Human Resources and Organizational Dynamics) and is also the Distinguished Research Chair in Advanced Business Leadership at the Canadian Centre for Advanced Leadership in Business. With his research, Dr. Steel considers personnel selection, culture, motivation, and procrastination. He has been recognized for exemplary teaching, is highly sought after as a featured speaker at conferences and events, and has published extensively, including his book, <i>The Procrastination Equation: How to stop putting things off and start getting things done</i>.</p> <p>According to his website, <a href="http://www.procrastinus.com">www.procrastinus.com</a>, Dr. Steel was "a practicing procrastinator from an early age". While completing his doctorate at the University of Minnesota, he began studying procrastination formally, eventually forming the focus of his dissertation, as well as for many of his other projects.
